MEDICATION SAFETY

Did you know that Pharmacists do much more than just fill Prescriptions? They can assess and treat for minor ailments such as:

- smoking cessation
- conjunctivitis (pink eye)
- uncomplicated urinary tract infections

Pharmacists can prescribe and administer vaccines such as:

- COVID-19
- Influenza
- Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B and Hepatitis A and B (including the TWINRIX vaccine)
- Shingles (Herpes Zoster)
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and
- Chickenpox (Varicella Zoster)

Pharmacists can also conduct a thorough medication review.

Do you struggle with your medications?

Pharmacists can provide solutions to help patients with medication adherence.

Blister packs are great options for patients who struggle to take their medication correctly. Your Pharmacist can package your medication into weekly blister packs to help make it easier for you to know what medications to take and when to take them.

Phyllis' Recipe Box Sour Cream Banana Bread

½ CUP BUTTER 1 CUP SUGAR

2 EGGS

2 TSP VANILLA

2 CUPS FLOUR

1 TSP BAKING SODA

1/2 TSP SALT

1 CUP BANANAS, MASHED

½ CUP NUTS, CHOPPED

½ SOUR CREAM

CREAM BUTTER WITH THE SUGAR. BEAT IN EGGS AND VANILLA. ADD DRY INGREDIENTS; MIX. ADD BANANAS, NUTS AND SOUR CREAM. POUR INTO A GREASED 8 ½ X 4½ INCH LOAF PAN. BAKE AT 350 F. FOR 1 HOUR.
